## Overview

Originating in Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek, the Bible is now the most translated book in the entire world. According to the Wycliffe Bible Alliance, as of 2022 the Bible has been translated into 724 languages, and parts have been translated to more than 3000 languages. The number of English translations numbers nearly 900. Many different considerations go into Biblical translation including which scholars take up the work, the sources used, style, intended audience, and even theological and/or denominational claims, all which could make even choosing a single English translation a daunting task. Finding the best translation for one's personal use could boil down to a matter of what seems to suit a person best in one's life of faith and study. Finally, a good translation is one which helps people learn the great story, dig into the complexities and depth of wisdom and discernment, and finally helps create, deepen, broaden, and maintain the mystery, beauty, and life of faith.

## **Questions Post-presentation:**
